How much does it cost to charge an electric vehicle in Tallinn?

It costs EUR5.23 to charge an electric vehicle in Tallinn. If you are charging an electric vehicle once a day, it will cost you a total of EUR156.9 per month. If you decide to charge your electric vehicle every 2nd day, you would save EUR78.45. * This is based on charging an electric vehicle, and using 45 kwh.

How many electric cars are there in Estonia?

Over a short time, Estonia has become the second country after Norway in the world in terms of the share of EVs. While there is one electric car registered per each 1,000 cars in Estonia, the respective figure for Norway is four. Estonia is followed by the Netherlands with 0.6 electric cars registered per 1,000 cars.

How much does it cost to charge an EV in Estonia?

Each Estonian town, as well as bigger villages now have their own fast chargers; the stations installed along highways maintain a minimum distance of 40 to 60 km. The EV users have three service packages to choose from, the cost of one charging is between 2.5 and 5 euros.

Why are Estonians not using electric vehicles?

According to the head of the Estonia's EV programme, Mr Jarmo Tuisk, it was the lack of a proper fast charging infrastructure that hindered a more widespread use of electric vehicles until now.

Depending on the car model and battery capacity, charging an electric car in Estonia at a public charging station can cost several times more than in other European countries.

Compared to cars with internal combustion engines, driving an electric car has several advantages: for example, electric cars can park for free in Tallinn city centre and use bus lanes, ...
